Rehabilitative training is intended to support young people/adults to progress onto their next stage of development in terms of education, work skills, independence and integration within their community. Young people/adults attend these courses for three to four years. The Rehabilitative Training Unit offers a range of ASDAN modules, and is working towards becoming a registered ASDAN curriculum provider. St. Cronans also works with local ETBs' to provide opportunities for additional accredited learning.



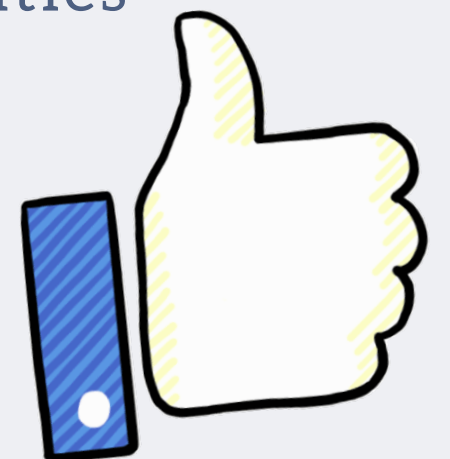
REHABILITATIVE TRAINING WILL PROVIDE:

School leavers with needs arising from one or more of the following:

- Intellectual Disability
- Sensory Disability: Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Blind, Visual Impairment
- Physical Disability
- Autistic Spectrum Disorder
- Mental Health Difficulties
- Life-Changing Illnesses Such As Heart Attack/Stroke



HOW CAN I APPLY FOR A PLACE?

The HSE has an Occupational Guidance Service in place to help school leavers and others who have significant support needs to find a training and support service that is suited to their needs.
